This Privacy Statement outlines the information **bold** collects via its various web pages and how we use that information. How we use your information

We do not share information collected with any other companies.

bold will not disclose your personally identifiable information unless required to do so by law or in the good faith and belief that such action is necessary to: (1) conform to the edicts of the law; (2) protect and defend the rights or property of **bold**.

Information collected automatically

We also collect certain information about our web visitors automatically, such as your domain name, the type of internet browser you use, and the operating system you use. This information is used only for internal review, to help us improve the content of our web pages.

Children
